The Work Placement Liaison Role

Our overall mission in the skills department is to address key skills gaps primarily in Yorkshire, but also across the UK as a whole. We are looking for a dynamic and imaginative individual with interest in training initiatives, to work with Screen Yorkshire's skills team and our film office to create and deliver a broad range of employment opportunities for alumni of our programmes. As a large part of work opportunities and skills training are predominantly in scripted production, knowledge and experience in this field would be valuable.

The Work Placement Liaison will be responsible for building relationships with regional employers and incoming production to create work placement opportunities for alumni of our training programmes. Furthermore, they will help to deliver Screen Alliance North initiatives aimed at upskilling our screen workforce in the North.

Our ambition is to engage and support under-represented individuals and communities to increase their employment opportunities with the Film and TV production sector. This role will require proactive community engagement and you should be able to demonstrate a strong commitment to inclusivity.

We want to make sure our workforce is diverse and representative of the communities we work with and particularly encourage applications from those who are underrepresented within the screen industries.

Main Responsibilities



- Liaise with production companies and other industry bodies to arrange and deliver work placements
- Negotiate and contract these opportunities between employers, Screen Yorkshire and crew, with the guidance of our Head of Skills and supported by our Skills Coordinator
- Organise and deliver skills related events in collaboration with the Head of Skills and the skills team
- Implement the activity plans within time, cost and quality parameters
- Work closely with all key partners and industry bodies nationally and regionally, including our partners at Screen Alliance North, other BFI Skills Clusters, BFI, educational institutions, broadcasters and independent producers
- Ensure that work remains aligned to the outcomes of the funding agreement between Screen Yorkshire and its relevant funding partners
- Assist Screen Yorkshire's Communications Manager in the promotion of success stories and case studies featuring both interns and employers
- Work with the Head of Skills and our Finance Team to formulate and manage budgets for all elements of programme delivery and to produce briefings and reports for funders
- Update the Head of Skills on ongoing developments in regular meetings
- Track and maintain contact with alumni of the programme
- Organise sessions and networking events as agreed with Head of Skills and within the programme budget
- Any additional tasks which arise as part of the delivery of the programmes in the skills department with the support of the Skills Coordinator
- Duties may include supporting other skills programmes as required

Work Placement Liaison Person Specification – Essential

- 5+ years of experience in the Film and TV industries in the UK, ideally in the drama production sector
- Experience or demonstrable keen interest in training and supporting individuals keen to secure a foothold in the Film and TV industry
- Excellent oral and written communication skills
- Excellent interpersonal skills and experienced in teamwork
- Flexibility and a 'can-do' attitude
- Excellent attention to detail and organisational skills
- Ability to prioritise and perform to a high standard while under pressure and working to deadlines

- Understanding of the skills shortages in the Film and TV sector across the UK and how these issues affect those trying to secure work within Yorkshire's screen industries, along with a commitment to their individual development
- Experience in training or mentoring new entrants to the industry
